TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

Under UK/EU law, <u>Buyers</u> must inform the Sports Pony Studbook Society (SPSS) within 30 days of purchase (or other transfer of ownership) of a pony/horse for which the SPSS has issued an Equine Passport.

The SPSS can also update ownership details for Scottish Sport Horse (SSH) issued passports if they relate to ponies on or under 148cm and for non-UK EU passports (eg a German or Dutch ones) for ponies (or small horses up to 158cm) that are eligible for SPSS overstamping (see note on page 2)

<u>Sellers</u>: Please complete and sign the Seller part of this form at the time of sale and pass onto the Buyer with the Equine Passport.

<u>Buyers</u>: Please ensure that the last name(s) in the Equine Passport is the person(s) from whom the pony is being purchased. Please complete and sign the Buyer part of the form and send it, with the Equine Passport and the Transfer Fee, to the SPSS Studbook Office at the above address. A signed receipt may be sent instead of the seller's signature on the form. We recommend that a padded envelope is used to protect the passport in transit.

Transfer Fee: £35 SPSS & SSH passports & SPSS overstamped non-UK EU passports

£40 for other non-UK EU passports (this fee includes basic SPSS overstamping, for more info see page 2)

Passports are returned by the Royal Mail "Tracked 24" service.

If you require return by Royal Mail "Special Delivery" please add £7 to the amount sent.

Passports Issued by organisations other then the SPSS

The SPSS can also update ownership details for:

- Scottish Sport Horse (SSH) issued passports if (and only if) they relate to ponies on or under 148cm. SSH horse passports are now maintained by SHB(GB) and their Change of Ownership Form can be found on their website.
- Non-UK EU passports (eg a German or Dutch one) for any pony (or small horse up to 158cm) that is eligible for SPSS overstamping apart from any pure-bred ponies that have a UK-based mother studbook (eg Welsh Sec A, B, C, D or Caspian). Examples of pony breeds that we will overstamp for the purpose of change of ownership etc include Deutsches Reitponies (DRP), NWPCS Sec K, NRPS, Danish Sports Ponies and similar. The SPSS then notifies the passport issuer of the changes. Note that this overstamping does not put a graded pony into the appropriate SPSS Studbook please contact us if that is required as well as the change of ownership.

The Data Protection Act 1998 - Notification of processing of personal data

It is required under data protection legislation to advise individuals about the processing of personal information ie. why this information is being collected, how this information will be used and the circumstances in which it will be disclosed.

The Sports Pony Studbook Society is therefore required to notify you that information supplied in connection with your pony ownership may be passed by this society to: the organisation that issued the passport (if other than the SPSS), the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), including to it's authorised database (historically, the National Equine Database (NED)) and to local authorities or law enforcement agencies as required by law.

Horse passport based information about horse and owner is collected by DEFRA in order to provide a source of data that supports veterinary disease control and surveillance activities. The information will also enable DEFRA to carry out its responsibilities regarding the implementation of the horse passport requirement. It will also facilitate strategic planning within the equine sector, assist in tracing the owners of straying, lost or stolen horses and reduce malpractice in the sale of horses and ponies. The data collected for this purpose will be adequate, relevant and not excessive for the above purposes.

The horse passport based information provided may, in future, be used for research purposes or statistical analysis. Your personal data may be shared, if necessary, within the DEFRA family and to other Central Government Departments, Non-Departmental Public Bodies and Local Authorities. Your personal details (ie name and address of horse owner) will be treated as confidential at all times and all data supplied will be kept secure. Data may be processed by a contracted third party that will also be required to keep all data secure.

In limited circumstances, DEFRA or its agents may be required to release information, including personal data and commercial information, on request under the Environmental Information Regulations, the Code of Practice on Access to Government Information or the Freedom of Information Act 2000. However, neither DEFRA nor its agents will permit any unwarranted breach of confidentiality nor will we act in contravention of our obligations under the Data Protection Act 1998.
